Morning Prayer in the Season after Pentecost

LIVING WITH THE PRINCIPLES OF THE ORDER: THE COMMUNITY OBEDIENCE

Here, and in all your churches throughout the world, we adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world. Amen.

Day Twenty-Four – The First Note (continued)

The faults that we see in others are the subject of prayer rather than of criticism. We take care to cast out the beam from our own eye before offering to remove the speck from another's. We are ready to accept the lowest place when asked, and to volunteer to take it. Nevertheless, when asked to undertake work of which we feel unworthy or incapable, we do not shrink from it on the founts of humility, but confidently attempt it through the power that is made perfect in weakness.

LECTIO DIVINA *Luke 21:20-28*

Jesus said, 'When you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation has come near. Then those in Judea must flee to the mountains, and those inside the city must leave it, and those out in the country must not enter it; for these are days of vengeance, as a fulfilment of all that is written. Woe to those who are pregnant and to those who are nursing infants in those days! For there will be great distress on the earth and wrath against this people; they will fall by the edge of the sword and be taken away as captives among all nations; and Jerusalem will be trampled on by the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled. There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

LISTENING FOR CHRIST THE WORD

- One person reads aloud the passage of scripture, as others listen for the word or phrase that is especially meaningful for them.
- Silence for two minutes.
- Each person hears and silently repeats a word or a phrase that has attracted them.
- Sharing aloud, each may make a single sentence statement of the word or phrase that has attracted them. No elaboration.

HOW CHRIST THE WORD SPEAKS TO ME

- Second Reading of the same passage by another person.
- Silence for two minutes reflecting on “How does the content of this reading touch my life today?”
- Share aloud, briefly, beginning with “I hear. . .” or “I see. . .”

WHAT CHRIST THE WORD IS INVITING ME TO DO

- Third Reading of the same passage by another person
- Silence for two minutes reflecting on “I believe that God wants me to . . . today/during this convocation.”
- Sharing aloud the result of each person’s reflection. Be especially aware of what is shared by the person on your right.
- After sharing, pray in turn, for the person on your right.
- Important note: Anyone may say “pass” at any time. If instead of sharing with the group you prefer to pray silently, simply state this aloud and conclude your silent prayer with “Amen.”

THE EXHORTATION

The Officiant continues

My brothers and sisters, you must always seek to be conformed to the image of our Lord Jesus Christ in the life you would embrace. Continue to serve him by prayer, study and active work for his Dominion. Be ready to endure hardness, calling to mind how our Savior has said that if we would serve him, then we must also follow him; that if we would come after him, we must deny self, take up our cross every day and follow him.

As you embrace this life of living sacrifice, call to mind the example of Saint Francis, the Poverello of Assisi. Let your life in his spirit of holy poverty make our Lord known and loved everywhere, and promote the spirit of love and unity within the family of God. And so observe your personal rule of life that you, like him, manifest humility, love, and joy in the Lord.

The Gospel life in the spirit of Saint Francis cannot be pursued but by the grace of him who said: "My yoke is easy and my burden is light." Let us therefore pray to the Lord that you may have grace to persevere in your chosen way.



The Celebrant proceeds

You are worthy, O God, to be worshipped and praised by all that you have made. For you loved the world so much that you gave your only Son, so that all might find new life in him. By your Holy Spirit, you anointed Jesus to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim freedom for prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, and to release those who are oppressed. Healing the sick, feeding the hungry, and feasting with sinners your Son proclaimed the Kingdom of God was at hand. Living among us Jesus revealed your glory, full of grace and truth. Yet the world rejected him, opposing his mission and witness.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

In all humility, Christ then accepted betrayal and death upon a cross for our redemption. Therefore, O Lord, you raised him from the dead and gave to Jesus the name above all other names, so that all might be humbled to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord of all.

Almighty God, as we celebrate this memorial of our redemption, we praise you for your love and mercy revealed in Jesus Christ our Lord. Remembering his death, rejoicing in his resurrection, we offer all we have and all we are to you.
