# "From henceforth call nothing thine own."

These words remain with me from many years ago while studying and writing about religious communities. This is what was said to each of the newly professed in the Kelham religious order. A long time later I became a Tertiary and could see how Francis was disturbed by the use of the possessive noun, 'mine' and 'my'. It is said that when a brother spoke of a place where Francis prayed as 'his cave' he never returned to that place.

Gospel life for Francis unlocked the joy of no longer being possessed by possessions. So, whenever I hear myself say 'my' or 'mine' it sounds like a door slamming on that joy of Francis. In our public life the Covac struggle with vaccines illustrates this as a disability: the G7 pledge by the nations possessing the greatest in the world to give one billion vaccines before 2024 is placed alongside the eleven billion requested by the World Health Organisation for the poorest of the world.

This edition of Third Order News can be read for glimpses of a religious order offering a gospel vision of "....a fresh attitude towards possessions" [Day 10 Principles].

As a Chapter we have been inspired to hear 29 names for Election to Profession this at time, the most for years, to share a gospel vision, an Order of life shared.

Francis points this way to peace and all good.

# June 2021 Chapter Digest

Summary of the main topics covered at the meeting of Chapter held by Zoom video conference, 10 -12 June, 2021. The minutes will be posted on the website after they have been approved by the October Chapter.

A Call To Re-focus

Our TSSF Province is being encouraged to refocus its identity and its purpose by reflecting upon the Vows of Profession given by all Tertiaries.

On Friday Dr Peta Dunstan, writer on Franciscans religious life and representing the Independent Review, presented to Chapter a paper on why TSSF is more than a community of interest, "Because tertiaries make vows before God and in public, this is an Order rather than a community."

However, although tertiaries may to live out their vocation in a variety of ways the Review Team is firmly of the view that those values and beliefs, expressed in the vows, are to be reflected in "a collective will and not a mosaic of individual opinions."

"The Review Team believes that the affirmation of the obligations and responsibilities of the tertiary life can be seen as a significant foundation to any changes it recommends" It is expected that a paper expressing these positions will be circulated to the Province as a focus for reflection.

#### Increased number of professions

Provincial Secretary, Martin Allen, reported that names of 29 Tertiaries were brought to Chapter and Elected for Profession since February, the most over four months for several years. Five tertiaries have been released from Vows and two people have requested leave of absence.

### New Bishop Protector calls in

Martyn Snow, Bishop of Leicester and the new TSSF Bishop Protector was introduced to Chapter. He showed a four minute video of The Tree of Life youth community in Leicester which he helped to found. Bp Martyn has a deep interest in monasticism. He will be joining Chapter for a longer period at the October session, at Launde Abbey.

#### General Chapter planning

Co-ordinators Tony Ross and Karen Vincent said planning is going well. They stressed that the events being held from now until the final 800th anniversary celebrations, to be held in four separate cathedrals in October 2022 are all very much part of the overall event. "In the past General Chapter lasted three days, ours is being spread over a much longer period, culminating in the final day of celebrations," explained Tony. The next event will be a Day of Joyful Penitence on September 14. More details in TON and on a dedicated online page which will be accessible from July 1. It is hoped that the Networks and various interest groups will provide resources for the year beginning in September 2021.

It is planned to produce a one-off publication telling stories and highlighting the life of all the five Provinces to help tertiaries feel more part of a world-wide Order, and to inform ou Franciscan life together.

#### New Editor of Little Portion appointed

Chapter was delighted to confirm Richenda Milton-Daws' appointment as the new Editor of Little Portion. Chapter recorded grateful thanks to Verena Tschudin who has shaped and nurtured Little Portion with the Editorial Team.

### Walking with people from Enquiry through to Profession

Provincial Novice Guardian, Tony Ross said the Formation Forum has been doing a great deal of work in providing resources, support, and processes for people at all stages of their formation. He stressed the need for all Enquirers to complete and return the Enquirer's form to the Provincial Novice Guardian who begins the conversations with each person before inviting them to attend their first TSSF meeting. This includes getting a recommendation from their local incumbent. Normally, Enquirer's should only attend two meetings before it is decided with them whether they wish to become a Postulant. This safe practice was also endorsed by Mandy Hughes, Provincial Safeguarding Officer. Provincial Minister, Tim Higgins underlined the expectation that novices will complete at least a two-year novitiate before being brought to Profession.

Tony reported The Formation Forum will be looking at the training notes for Novice Guardians, and support for Convenors.

Martin stressed that Alan Williams, Membership Secretary, needs to know the precise date of when someone is Noviced, for Data Protection purposes. Olavi Heino (Finland) said there are plans to translate the Novice Guardian material into Finnish.

Keeping in touch across the Province

Sally Hastings, Communications Guardian, interim, set out for Chapter the channels through which we speak to each other and receive reports from. The Communications Team meets to keep all these in conversation and purpose.

Website is being updated

Deputy website editor Karen Vincent reported that it is hoped to have a revised website up and running by October. At the moment it does not work well for tertiaries and only a small number access it.

Social Media Group

A small group is meeting to explore this and take it forward.

TSSF YouTube channel

The Order now has its own channel and a small group will be formed to take that forward.

Looking world-wide

In his Minister Provincial's report Tim spoke of the five Ministers' Provincial privilege to meet regularly on Zoom thus catching the vision of a worldwide movement. We are sisters and brothers with all the life of creation aiming for the harmony addressed in our Principles "There is no substitute for talking and live communication. Email alone so easily escalates to misunderstandings!"

Franciscans, Indigenous Peoples and Creation

Tim reported that the five Provinces are planning to speak with a Franciscan voice taking ecological action. About 25 percent of ecologically intact landscapes are in the care of indigenous peoples. "Exploitation of these precious places perpetrates abuse against the very people whose relationship to land and Creation bears the wisdom from which we can humbly learn." The video will be used to promote discussion in a variety of forums, including The Lambeth Conference. It will cost around £6,500. Two provinces have already made contributions and an application for a funding contribution from Europe will be considered by Chapter's new initiative, 'Funding Our Purpose'.

This is part of a commitment by Chapter to be clearly accountable with all expenditure being in line with the Object and Principles of the Order and a chance to excite new pieces of work in our Areas and Province.

**Data Protection Changes** 

Martin said he will notify Areas of data protection changes in the law due to Brexit, in due course.

Provincial Elections Officer needed.

There is a vacancy for a Provincial Elections Officer. If you are interested please contact Martin.

2021 Budget

Provincial Treasurer said The Order is in good heart and has donated some £52,000 to Franciscan causes.

Two more Safeguarding Advocates needed.

Provincial Safeguarding Officer, Mandy Hughes reported a busy year. She is working nationally and at all levels to strengthen links, processes and procedures. In order to share in running some of the processes and tasks in the Province Mandy is creating a small team. These will be Provincial Safeguarding Advocates, like a mirror of the Area Advocates. If you know of any likely candidate please let Mandy (safe@tssf.org.uk) or Martin know.

May Heldal is recovering

Christer Sall, Area Secretary, Sweden, reported that May Heldal, Area Minister, is still recovering from a serious fall, but is grateful for our prayers and good wishes.

Farewells and Blessings

Chapter prayed farewell with Wendy Scott, former Link Tertiary for East Midlands and Yorkshire Cluster and with Peter Thompson, former Link Tertiary for Central South England Cluster. Tim said how they would be greatly missed in Chapter.

We also welcomed and prayed Blessings in their new Link Tertiary roles for David McCormick and Lou Scot-Joynt.

#### Tertiaries care about their Order

The 2021 Survey of TSSF Membership, prepared for the Independent Review Team, was well supported. It showed that many tertiaries take a great interest in the Order and regard it with a good deal of affection.

It also confirmed that Tertiaries hold a wide range of views regarding the Mission of the Order and the role of Chapter. There was almost complete agreement that The Third Order should help tertiaries embody Franciscan convictions in their service to the Church and the world.

Tertiaries felt that Chapter should find ways of consulting more strongly with them, with decision making by consensus. Most felt that Chapter should serve resources and lead the Order and maintain its structures, but were unhappy with the notion that Chapter should "set the direction."

Most tertiaries felt the Minister Provincial should be regarded as the leader of the Order within the Province but were unclear about how much autonomy they should have. Around 56 percent of the Order is over 70 years old.

The full survey will be distributed to The Order via Area Ministers and MailChimp.

Those who took part in the Province Quiet Day on 28 April will remember the 'Padlet' noticeboard used by Constantina Alexander. The General Chapter Planning Team is in the process of setting up a similar noticeboard. Watch this space!

### The G7 In Cornwall

When the G7 were due to descend on Carbis Bay, the Cornwall Area decided to formulate a response which would be prayerful but, we hoped, challenging too – primarily to ourselves. We organized a Quiet Day led by our CJP lead, Peter Bonsey, but with COVID restrictions not many people from our Area, let alone more widely, could attend in person. So, we decided to make the event available on line.

On Saturday 12th June, as the G7 leaders gathered, around 100 tertiaries joined our event via Zoom and 34 stayed for the informal break out discussion groups at the end. The first talk was live-streamed from Truro which made a special connection between those attending live and 'virtually'.

It was wonderful to feel part of the larger Franciscan family and the event was a great blessing to us in Cornwall and we hope for others. Particular thanks are due to Peter Bonsey for his work putting the talks together – many have found them stimulating and challenging.
